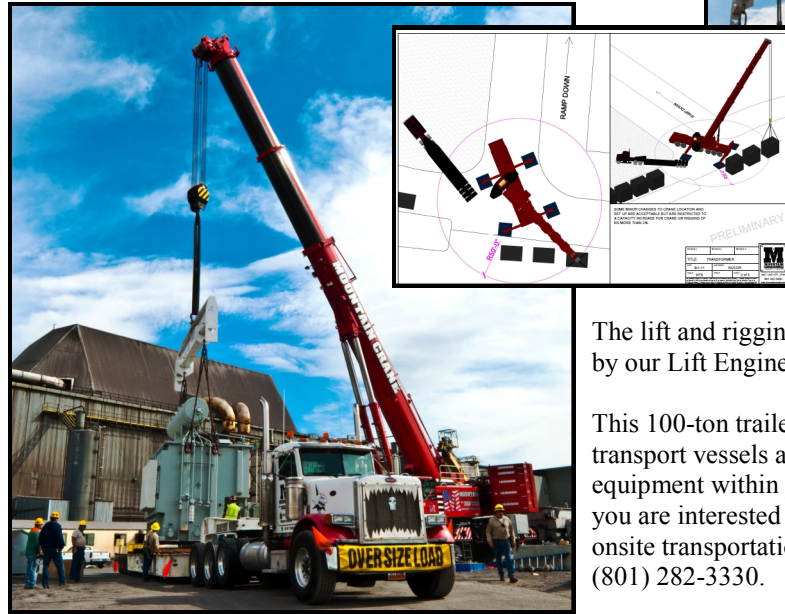

Nucor Steel

Earlier this year, Mountain Crane Service was asked to move a transformer within the Nucor Steel plant. Utilizing our Liebherr LTM1400 500 Ton All Terrain, our crews placed the 160,000 lb. transformer onto a 100-ton trailer. The crane was then disassembled and subsequently built up to unload the transformer at its final destination.
